STATISTICS SHOW

A study conducted by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and The National Cancer Institute of over 8,000 participants in 1999-2000 measured the adequate daily intake of fruits and vegetables and found that fewer than 11% met the minimum requirements. Only 17% of women aged 51-70 met their recommend dose with less than 1% of boys aged 14-18 meeting theirs.
